Students will use stitches for bracelets, key chain fobs, bookmarks, and bows suitable for hair, hats, or shirts. 2-day camp. <p>Intro to Piecing and Quilting. Learn to make 4-patches, 9-patches, half-square triangles, and log cabin blocks—basic blocks. Class will cover fabric selection, cutting, stitching, and pressing. Students will make a throw pillow and a 12-inch block in red, white and blue to be exhibited at the Eastern Idaho State Fair’s Quilt Block Challenge. About Summer Sewing Camps

1. Each project is a separate camp.
2. Camps are one, two, or three sessions long. The price is for that whole camp.
3. Each session is 3 hours: 9 AM to noon, or 1:15 to 4:15.
4. We provide a healthy snack in the middle of each session.
5. Students can come to any number of camps but only one each day.
6. There are no camps Friday afternoons.
7. Most camps are repeated twice on the same day.
8. Very popular camps may be given in both June and July.
9. 10% discount for siblings and friends who register together.
10. Children age 7-15. *Wardrobe Maintenance* is open to teens up to age 18.
11. A Materials List is emailed at the time of registration. If you are unsure what to buy, ask for the store’s Manager On Duty to help you. Students who do not have proper materials will be sent home and no refunds will be given.
12. Attendance is limited at each camp so each student gets personal attention.
13. No experience is necessary. We provide sewing machines and tools.
